SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN SUMMARY 2024 - 2025

Progress against Priorities 2023 -2024

Ensure that specific professional learning has a positive impact on provision and standards in RE, Catholic life and prayer and liturgy worship.

- Training on the (Religious Education Directory) RED has taken place in collaboration with other diocesan schools, and we trialled the RED successfully in three classes and standards were good in RE through the school.
- The prayer areas in the school were created and used regularly by our prayer group and other pupils.
- Training on each monthly devotions was given and the whole school prayed together the devotion each month.
 The prayer altars in the classes reflected the monthly prayer focus

To increase opportunities for pupils and staff to raise their standards in Welsh oracy.

- The pupils were provided with many opportunities to speak Welsh through the activities, after school clubs, visits and trips
- Nearly all staff have all attended professional learning during 2023-24 to develop their Welsh.
- It was agreed that the language category of the Foundation Learning would be changed to Welsh, and a nursery established in Saint Padam's for the first time.

Develop meaningful opportunities for pupils to develop their extended writing across the curriculum – Estyn recommendation.

 Professional learning with a focus on oracy ensured that the pupils' vocabulary developed and feed into the writing the pupils produced through the many genres of writing.

Provide opportunities for pupils to influence what and how they learn – Estyn recommendation.

- Independent learning was developed in Key Stage 2 through challenges and the use of Genius Hour in Year 5/6
- The NPEP project allowed the pupils to conduct their own research project to expand the reading resources in the Year 4/5 and 5/6 classes and develop a love of reading.

It was felt by the school and peer reviewers that the Estyn recommendations from March 2023 have been met.

Priorities during 2024 -2025

Continue the implementation of the Religious Education Directory (RED) and aspects of the Prayer and Liturgy Directory and achieve the Live Simply Award to improve standards of Catholic Education in the school.

- The RED will be trialled in all classes through the year covering the curriculum for Early Years, Year 1, Year 3 and Year 5. We aim to secure standards by using the new driver words.
- Pubil-led worship will continue to be developed.
- We aim to achieve the Simply Live CAFOD award by the end of the academic year.
- To action the recommendations of the Catholic Schools Inspection CSI recommendations.

To continue to offer professional development for all staff in preparation of the transition to Welsh medium education and to integrate the newly formed Welsh medium nursery class.

- To continue to ensure that staff have opportunities to develop their Welsh through sabbaticals and courses.
- To continue to develop and ensure progression of Welsh oracy of the publis throughout the school.
- To organise opportunities for the pupils and staff to practise their Welsh oracy skills.

To improve English spelling and handwriting standards so that all pupils can communicate accurately and clearly.

- To provide training to staff to deliver the spelling and handwriting schemes.
- To purchase the necessary resources and allocate sufficient to deliver improvements in spelling and the handwriting of the pupils.

Continuous Improvement:

Attendance

- To monitor the attendance of the pupils and address any issues that relate to attendance.
- To trial strategies to support pupils who are experiencing Emotion Based School Avoidance (EBSA)

Provide opportunities for pupils to choose what and how they learn.

 To consider how differentiation can be further <u>enhance</u> independent learning opportunities to impact positively on pupil standards at all levels.
