What we need from you

At the beginning of each year an email is sent regarding different permissions, allergies and contact information. This is a legal requirement, please complete forms promptly. We also ask that you read and sign our ICT Acceptable Use Policy.

The law regarding attendance registers is very specific. All absences must be recorded with an absence code; therefore, an email with a brief explanation of the reason for the absence, or a phone call or a text to the school mobile before 9:30am is required. We will attempt to phone you at home if we haven't heard from you.

It is slightly different for nursery pupils as they are under the school age for required attendance, but it helps us to know they are safely at home with you if they are not in school for their expected session. Illnesses and infections are very easily passed on - should your child fall ill or pick up an infection, please keep him/her home until the risk of infection has




passed. It would also be appreciated if you could telephone us to keep us updated.

Being 'school ready'

As parents and carers, you are your child's first teachers. You have a powerful influence on your child's early learning. There is clear research that proves that those children who work outside of school alongside their family, achieve more.

Tips and tricks

- Managing their own needs (toileting, getting dressed, putting a coat on).
- Recognising their name- add labels to school clothes so that it is easy to recognise.
- Making their own choices give a choice of two things, would you like to ... or ...?
- Putting things away when they are finished with provide them with the responsibility of tidying up after themselves at home.
- Using utensils encourage to cut up their own food, practise by cutting up playdough or kinetic sand.
- Talk to your child positively about how much he/she is going to enjoy school. Tell him/her what you will be doing while he/she is in school.
- Remember to say that you will collect him/her later when he/she has had time to play.
- Walk past school through the summer holidays and tell your child this is where they
 will be coming to 'big school'.



Foundation Phase Curriculum

We have a topic each half term and, in the nursery class, the pupil voice contributes heavily into what the children learn. We listen to their ideas and take into account their interests when planning activities.

Developmental Pathways

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through 5 Developmental Pathways. The five developmental pathways include:

Belonging

- To learn about our school environment and the local area.
- To start to understand about the chronology of their life.

Communication

- Listening to stories, songs and poems through the medium of Welsh
- Begin to hear sounds in words.
- Learn and use new vocabulary
- Begin to develop pencil control and start making marks on paper
- Reading individual words and eventually sentences
- Singing, rhymes and games
- Use of lots of repetition
- Daily dos and everyday language



Exploration

- Lots of number rhymes, songs, stories and counting games through the medium of Welsh.
- Matching, sorting and comparing familiar objects.
- Relating mathematical objects to everyday life.
- Encouraged to be curious and ask questions
- Using digital technologies.
- Learning about our local environment and finding out how things work.
- Developing their imagination and creativity.
- Painting, drawing, music, movement, and role play
- Lots of multi-sensory activities.



Well-being

- Supporting your child as he or she starts to gain independence and develops social skills when interacting with other children and adults.
- Helping the children to become confident, safe, secure and ready to learn from new experiences.
- Celebrating different cultures and gain a positive awareness of their own culture and religion.
- Using 'To Know You More Clearly' Diocesan approved scheme of work for Religious Education. It is a child-friendly creative scheme which teaches the children about Jesus, the Catholic faith and other faiths.

Physical Development

- Using small tools e.g. pencils, and scissors, through enhanced provision, in order to develop their fine motor skills.
- Playing on or with large and small equipment to develop balance, movement and coordination.



Assessment

As your child settles in school, he / she will be observed by the class teacher. This enables the teacher to establish what your child can already do and plan the way forward. There will be a parents' evening for you to attend during the Autumn and Spring Terms and the opportunity to chat to the class teacher, shortly after your child starts school.



A typical day in Dosbarth Clarach

Afternoon

12.55pm

Children collected from St Padarn's Playgroup or from main school gate.

1pm

Welcome into class and sit together to discuss the afternoon session.

Phonics or counting on mat.

1.15-2.30pm

Class activities, indoors and outdoors. Woodland session once a week.

2.30 - 3pm

Playtime on Top Court

3 - 3.15pm

Tidy up time, storytime and milk, show and tell, singing, child celebration.

3.15 - 3.25pm

Children collect all of their things, end of day prayer and home time.

Home Time

We ask parents to collect their children from the hall patio.

We will not let children go to the care of someone we do not know. Please let the school know if someone different is collecting your child. We will not release children to unknown adults.

All parents are asked to ensure that they, or whoever is collecting their child, parks considerately in the Vicarage Field car park. This is essential as the traffic conditions at the bottom of the school drive can be very dangerous. For this same reason children are not allowed to go past the Dove Gate, half-way down the school drive, without being accompanied by an adult.

What to bring each day

- Please label your child's uniform.
- Coat every day please (unpredictable Welsh weather!)
- Fruit or vegetables for afternoon break if you wish.
- Water bottle (only water)
- Weather dependent: warm hats, scarves and gloves (the children have free flow outside). In the summer sun hats and sun cream (we would advise you to apply this before the afternoon session).

Nut free school

We currently have pupils in school who have severe allergies. We ask that you refrain from sending in any nuts or products containing nuts.



What to wear

School sweatshirts and polo shirts are purchased in Ffigar Sports which is located on the Science Park in Llanbadarn or from Alison Jones Schoolwear on the Industrial Estate. School uniform <u>must be worn</u> by all pupils. We recommend trousers with elasticated waistbands (no belts please) and shoes with Velcro straps. Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled.

Safeguarding and Child Protection

We have four safeguarding officers, Mrs Enid Brophy (Designated Safeguarding Person), Mrs Mandy Rowe, Mrs Rhian Parry and Mrs Leanne Field (Designated Safeguarding Officers). Our main priority is to keep your children safe during their time at St Padarn's. If you have any concerns about safeguarding, please do not hesitate to contact one of the safeguarding officers.
